## Chi Phi Looks Ahead to Helping Out Again in 2018

**Low Country Boil:** In honor of the James Alexander Memorial Foundation

This Fall, in light of the unfortunate tropical storms, the funds raised from this event went to "Love City Strong" benefitting Hurricane Irma Relief in the Caribbean. We chose to donate to "Love City Strong" because **James Alexander**, a Chi Phi alum who recently passed, enjoyed vacationing with his family in the Virgin Islands and so in his name, we donated all of the funds to help the island chain recover from the devastating disaster. Our chapter teamed up with the sisters of Chi Omega to plan the boil. We were in charge of getting the word out on campus



and to the Greek community as well as selling tickets. The event was held at Chi Phi and a local band, Shakedown Street, played. The brothers set up the event as well as helped in the kitchen to prepare the food while the girls of Chi Omega served food and collected tickets. The Chi Phi chapter raised \$2,000 from their own ticket sales and contributed in the event's total fundraising of \$5,500. This fundraising event continues to remain the main event in the fall.

## **Bands for Hands Benefit Concert**

The other two events from the Fall semester included our help with the *Bands for Hands* benefit concert. The event raises money for *The Helping Hand Project*, an organization started by a Chi Phi alumni that builds affordable prosthetic hands for children using 3D printing technology. This event is an annual tradition for the brothers of Chi Phi.

Additionally, the Chapter's continued its involvement with Operation Smile, a charity focused on cleft palate surgery for children. We hosted their Fall event at our house. Ryan Cody, the founder of Operation Smile at UNC had this to say about Chi Phi's involvement with the organization:

"Chi Phi has shown consistent dedication to the cause by inspiring students, spreading awareness, and raising money. For the last two years, Chi Phi has hosted Operation Smile's largest fundraiser at UNC, Songs for Smiles. This event features a lineup of local bands and is open to the community. Both years have been a success, raising enough money for 15 surgeries. Without this fundraising, 15 children would be walking around somewhere in the world with an inability to eat, attend school, or receive a kiss from a loved one. However, Operation Smile and Chi Phi partnered together to give these 15 children a bright life."

We will be partnering again with Operation Smile this month to host the 10th annual Cleft Palate Gallop, a 5k raising money for the organization. We will be sure to include more information on that as details become available.

After graduation, Garrell was a small-town produce broker, fruit and vegetable operator and a convenience store operator. His biggest accomplishment is being the owner of Jimmy G's convenience store, where he trademarked the slogan, "Give a smile away every day."

In addition to creating his own slogan, Garrell has worked on

commercials with other stores and 94.9FM and yourbeachmusic. com. He is currently a member of the Rams Club and a Deacon at Tabor City Baptist Church. He also has an award named after him at the Kenan-Flagler Business School.

Still a sports fan, Garrell does his best to go back to campus for football weekends and basketball games. ## NIC Bolsters Health and Safety Standards Nationwide

Despite no-hazing policies and other rules and regulations in place, no campus is safe from the fraternity-related injuries, deaths, and other tragedies that have dominated the headlines in recent years. In response, the North-American Interfraternity Council made some major announcements in 2017 regarding the need for improved safety and health measures for fraternities nationwide and their plan to address said needs.

- A medical Good Samaritan Policy to encourage fraternity members to contact 911 in any medical emergency situations.
- Baseline health and safety
