How The Sullivans' Legacy Enriches their Fraternity Experience

You'd be hard pressed to find Chi Phi brothers who have a closer bond, despite their age difference, than **Taylor Sullivan '13** and **Bryan Sullivan '86**. But that comes with the territory when brothers are also father and son.

"A lot of my dad's closest friends were from Chi Phi and I met a ton of them growing up," Taylor recalls. "We took a yearly football trip to a Carolina game and tailgated at the house, so I got to know a lot of them."

"I had a level of expectation that he might join Chi Phi, but I told him to look at all the fraternities at Chapel Hill," Bryan says. "Each one has good and bad, but he just had to find the right fit. During the rush process, he met the members and felt comfortable there."

"It was really special to walk in the house and see my dad there," Taylor says. "I just really liked all of the guys that I met there, and the house is in such a beautiful location."

Having his son join Chi Phi gave Bryan an opportunity to get more involved with the chapter.

"It was a definite benefit," Bryan says.
"Being around the house and being
comfortable with his brothers allowed me to
get to know them better. Our whole family

progress through college and their careers.

Taylor agrees, saying that his father was able to lend advice to the chapter and create relationships with his brothers that would have been missed if it wasn't for their family bond. "My dad had a vested interest in the house and saw the challenges we faced."

Although Bryan—who is a golf pro and had a career path to follow in the industry—didn't rely on the professional connections that come with being a Chi Phi, Taylor benefited from the networking opportunities.

He now hosts a yearly golf tournament with his father's help at Kilmarlic Golf Club in Powells Point, NC, where Bryan is the director of golf. Alumni from Taylor's era come from New York, California, and Denver to network and catch up.

"Without his help and blessing, we could never do anything like that," Taylor says.

Bryan also sees his Chi Phi brothers annually around the golf course, although they gather for a less formal weekend event. Whether at golf outings, around the house, or at football tailgates, both father and son enjoy the relationship with each other, and their brothers, that their legacy has enabled.

Bouncing Back After Past Mistakes

Undergrads Stepping Up, Re-Inventing Chi Phi

The last few years brought some unique challenges to our chapter, but we are happy to share that the undergrad chapter has made significant strides to overcome them.

Now, after a one-year probation in 2014 and implementing a live-in advisor to provide structure and guidance, the chapter is taking their commitment to each other as brothers—and their responsibility as UNC students—seriously.

"Our chapter has had to deal with more adversity than most on campus as well as across the nation," says Lane Jones. "Dealing with strict sanctions from the school following previous mistakes coupled with David Shannon's passing has taught the chapter what it truly means to come together as a brotherhood. This past year and a half, we have done well to project an image of ourselves across campus that is representative of our values. Learning from our past hardships has been more beneficial than anyone could have foreseen."

Thanks in part to these tough lessons, the chapter is thriving today. Here are just a few statistics to prove it:

- This fall, 24 upstanding young men joined Chi Phi and more than 100 men showed interest in the chapter.
- The undergrads raised \$6,000

- at the Chi Phi & Chi Omega Low Country Boil (funds will support North Carolina Coastal Conservation).
- The group received a cumulative 3.316 GPA, which tops the All Greek GPA (3.294), the All Fraternity GPA (3.228), and the All Men GPA (3.182).

"Holding brothers to their word is very important to our organization," say Jones. "Creating initiatives surrounding scholarly performance is a great motivator."

That's why poor academic performance now results in chores, like dishes and general house cleaning, and party restriction.

Looking ahead, the group aims to double their pledge class numbers and recruit the best and brightest. Best of all, they're eager to get alumni more involved.

"There is so much to be learned from even just a single alum returning," Jones says. "We want to continue to become a better chapter each year, and we believe the wisdom of alumni is a necessity in order to do this."
